*Individual Schools*–

- **Neal Wilkins and Westview Elementary Schools** – serves students grades one through four. These schools practice strong parent/teacher/student relationships to strengthen their learning environment.
- **Platteville Middle School** – serves students grades 5 through 8. The faculty here focuses on teaching the “whole” child.
- **Platteville High School** – provides an excellent college preparatory curriculum while also providing strong technical and work experience programs as well.
